

Community Achievement Award

Entries in this category may be for physical or economic development, publications or promotions, improved efficiency, revitalization, or any other outstanding achievement by a community. Awards are presented in multiple population categories.

Larry A. Conrad Civic Service Award

Recognizes a private citizen, company or civic organization for their private sector service to municipal government.

Local Government Cooperation Award

Awarded to a city, town or county cooperative effort for important, innovative or extraordinary cooperation between municipalities or other government entities.

Russell G. Lloyd Distinguished Service Award

Given to an individual who has made outstanding contributions to local government. Nominees should have achievements beyond the nominee's community; public service, personal initiative, leadership and contributions to IACT are considered.

Ivan H. Brinegar Municipal Management Award

Presented to an appointed municipal official with a minimum of 10 years of city or town service and who displays strong leadership, contributes to their community and serves as a role model to citizens or other municipal officials.

Financial Management Award

Awarded to a finance officer or administrator who has made outstanding achievements in fiscal management, financial recording and leadership in public service.

Nelson Steele Memorial Award

Awarded to an individual who has gone above and beyond their duty while demonstrating outstanding contributions to municipal government and IACT; exemplifies and encourages leadership, participation and innovation to further the Association's Mission; is employed with a firm that is a current IACT Associate Member; and has a minimum of five years experience working with municipal government.

Note: Please limit your supporting materials to those that best explain or summarize the program. Materials are copied and included in a packet distributed to each judge. A two page, well-written summary is generally better than a binder of miscellaneous project materials.
